



Heinz G. Puff

April 13, 1922 - October 20, 2017

Heinz Gerhard Puff, age 95, died October 20, 2017, at Lake Shore Assisted Living. Heinz, along with his wife, Caroline, who preceded him in death in 2014, were longtime residents on Little Spider Lake in Arbor Vitae. Heinz was born in Dresden, Germany and came to the United States as a young child. He grew up and attended school in Milwaukee, became an Army soldier, and fought in World War II. He spent 39 months in the South Pacific, being awarded a number of service medals, and returned to Milwaukee following the war. He served a career as a Milwaukee police officer before retiring to Arbor Vitae. He and his wife, Caroline, loved the area, enjoying fishing, snowmobiling, and other northwoods activities. Also, they enjoyed traveling, making a number of trips to Europe. For many years in retirement, Caroline was proprietor of The Fair Exchange in Woodruff (at the corner of 51 and 47), and Heinz drove school bus. Heinz and Caroline had two children, Carol Puff Payne, who lives in England, and Gary Michael Puff, who died in 2006. Like his father, Gary served in the military and as a Milwaukee area police officer. Daughter Carol Payne and her husband, Stephen, have two children, Benjamin Payne and Oliver Payne. Benjamin and his wife, Nicola Molendo-Payne have two children, Roni and Franki. Oliver and his wife, Phillippa, have one child, Ethan. Gary's wife is Nancy McConnell Puff and Gary's children are Daniel Puff, Kevin Puff, and Kristine Hinnners. Kristine has two children, Madelyn and Cooper. Also, Heinz is survived by one nephew, Steve Kern and his wife Debbie. Heinz lived a life devoted to his country, his dear wife, Caroline, and his family and friends. A book about the life of Heinz, titled "Puff," was published in 2013. A memorial service for both Heinz and Caroline Puff is being scheduled for a future date when family members from England are able to attend.
