On June 24, 1950, Rosalie married Richard Hunsbuscher in Port Edwards, WI. Rosalie taught Home Economics at Elcho, Mattoon and Antigo Unified School District for 25 years. She also was a lunch supervisor for Antigo Unified District for 5 years. Rosalie served as a Chairperson for the Home Economics Department in Antigo, was a building rep for AEA, a member of the AEA, WEA and NEA and a member of the Langlade County Teachers Association. After retiring in 1984, Rosalie remained a retired member of WEA-R and NEA-R. Rosalie was an active member at Peace Lutheran Church in Antigo and Rock of Ages Lutheran Church in Minocqua. She belonged to the Women's Missionary League and was also a past president. Rosalie also enjoyed participating in events and activities at the Woodruff Senior Center. Rosalie was preceded in death by her parents; husband, Dick; brother and sister in law's, Kenneth and Bette Pihringer and Ken and Shirley Hunsbusher and son in law, Bruce Lutz.
