



Thomas H. Nilsson

November 3, 1943 - January 23, 2017

Thomas Harold Nilsson, age 73 of Minocqua, passed away on January 23, 2017 at his residence with his loving family by his side.

Born November 3, 1943, in Chicago, Illinois, Tom was the youngest son of Harold and Margaret (Smith) Nilsson. Upon graduating from Culver Stockton University, Tom went on to further his education at the University of Tennessee. Tom served in the United States Marine Corps and later had a successful career in education and coaching, retiring with the Department of Defense Dependent Overseas Education System in 2005.

Tom was very active in his local communities in particular the St Matthias Episcopal Church – Veterans Breakfast, Community Table, Frederick Place, Survivor’s Dinner, Usher, Lay Reader and the Northwoods Model Railroad club.

Tom loved spending time in the outdoors, coaching and watching his children and grandchildren grow into their adult lives. He particularly enjoyed spending time at the family cottage on Clear Lake during his summer breaks from teaching. He and his wife eventually built their retirement home in Minocqua to be closer to the family cottage.

He is survived by his wife Betty J. (Raysa), two daughters, Elizabeth (Nilsson) Waters and spouse Clifford of Vancleave, MS and Helen Nilsson and spouse Jenny Wendell of Pataskala, OH. Tom’s two grandchildren: Kristen (Waters) Wheelock and spouse Ryan of Biloxi, MS and Gordon Waters and finance Christina Hamil of Biloxi, MS. Tom’s brother Jerry Nilsson and spouse Carol of Cadillac, MI, one niece Carrie Nilsson Boykin and one nephew Eric Nilsson and numerous family and friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents.
