



## Felix Bonvouloir

March 17, 1919 - May 5, 2012

Felix D. Bonvouloir, age 93, of Lake Tomahawk, passed away on Saturday, May 5, 2012 at Howard Young Medical Center in Woodruff. Felix was born on March 17, 1919 in Hartford, CT, the son of Felix J. and Ella (nee Pfurr) Bonvouloir. Felix served in the National Guard and was then drafted into the Armed Services. He served during World War II in Germany and in the Infantry as a Private, where he was then promoted to Captain. Felix worked for Sony as an Electronics Engineer and started the first TV studios in the Midwest area. He was a member of the American Legion Post #318 and Lions Club. He was proud to have been nominated Legionnaire of the Year in 1993 for Post #318. Felix loved the organ, was an avid bowler and enjoyed working bingo and the concession stand for the American Legion. Felix was preceded in death by his parents; wife, Delight Bonvouloir in 2003 and brother, Raoul (Fran) Bonvouloir.
