Junior G. Lehman "Whitey", age 81 of Woodruff and formerly of Three Lakes and Bear Creek passed away Tuesday, April 19, 2011 at the Seasons of Life Hospice House in Woodruff, WI.

Whitey was born September 7, 1929, the son of Albert and Viola Lehman. He grew up in Bear Creek and married Dona Bonack of Three Lakes, July 21, 1951.

After serving in the U.S. Army and attending U.W. Oshkosh and Madison, Whitey made his career in education. He taught school and was the Three Lakes School District Administrator, serving the district for 33 years.
