Larry H. Krull, age 87, of Lac du Flambeau, WI and formerly of Peoria, IL, passed away peacefully on Sunday, January 7, 2024. He was born on February 26, 1936 in Woodstock, IL, the son of Harold and Myrtle (nee Wolf) Krull. Larry was a research chemist for the USDA for over 30 years.
