bonds by her Creator. Her valiant, courageous struggle with a rare and aggressive form of

lymphoma is over. We are sure Laura will continue her service to God as one of the

brightest angels. She is the one with the wit and beguiling humor, the one with the gentle

touch who reached out to help others, and who had a capacity for unselfish love that is

preciously rare. Laura valued simplicity and a lack of pretense. She was the real deal.

Laura is survived by her friend, helpmate, husband, and love, John Logan. He is certain she

was the better half of him as they lived quiet lives at their Ballard Lake home and amongst

the forest and waters of Star Lake. Laura gave John joy, trust, and devotion beyond

compare. Through longing, misty eyes John can still see her working her

flower garden,
walking their beloved dogs, Elvis and then Jack, and sharing special moments
at the home
they built together.
Smart, quick study, energetic Laura became a logistic expert in California and
then in Las
Vegas, Nevada developing and managing systems for El Portal, a major
specialty item
national retailer. After many years on the West Coast she returned to her
native Minnesota
for a brief, successful stint running a dog grooming business. After meeting
John in 2004
she soon joined him in the Northwoods and returned to her logistics career,
ultimately as
Logistics Manager and part of the management team for Allied 100 in
Woodruff. Laura was
proud of her job and admired the founders of the company, Jon and Ken. Her
dedication
and bravery would be seen as she showed up at Allied to supervise her crew
and “trouble
shoot” with the other departments ignoring her remaining wisps of hair and the
chemo
pain that wracked her body. Laura was absolutely remarkable.
In her private life, Laura touched the hearts and souls of many at the
Community Church of
Boulder Junction and in her community activities. She shared her own
personal recovery
as a friend of Bill W. with hundreds from California to Toronto. Laura was
effective from
the podium and across the kitchen table with her insight, directness,
compassion, ability to

cut to the chase, and infectious laugh. The countless days and hours she invested to help others to recover, asking nothing in return, exemplified her life as one of spiritual anonymity and as a follower of Christ. "Of myself I am nothing, the Father doeth the works" was more than a slogan to her.

Laura is survived by her mother, Marjorie Carter (nee, Hall), her brother Steve Hubbard;

her sister Cyndi Hall; and aunts, uncles, nieces, and nephews ... some of whom she

devotedly raised for many years as a fill-in parent. She will also be deeply missed by dear

friends from California, Nevada, Ontario, Minnesota, Wisconsin, and elsewhere. Laura

magnanimously embraced John's children and grandchildren as if they were her own. In

time, they may understand like many others how their lives were touched and enriched by
