

## Lois L. Hunter

December 20, 1933 - January 24, 2017

Lois Hunter (nee Luther) passed away peacefully at Milestone Senior Living Center on Tuesday, January 24th after a courageous battle with Lewy Body Dementia. Lois was born December 20, 1933 to Hilda Luther (nee Johnson), and George Luther in Evanston, IL.

Lois was a 1951 graduate of Evanston Township High School in Evanston, IL. Upon graduation, she began a 48 year career at the Sigma Chi Fraternity headquarters, also in Evanston. She dedicated her career to the members of the fraternity and its charitable affiliates. One of Lois's favorite projects to work on were the ones that involved Children's Miracle Network, where she helped facilitate raising thousands of dollars in support of that organization.

Lois is remembered by family in a variety of happy ways. Lois had a strong Christian faith, and she lived her life in God's light. She was caring and graceful, she believed anything was possible, and was always willing to lend a helping hand to those in need. Lois loved gardening, and spending time as a family playing games such as Golf, 10,000, and Monopoly. She loved spending time with her granddaughters going to movies. She always loved having them climb into bed with her in the morning and just "chit chatting" with them before starting the day. Lois taught us all to be better people, not to take life too seriously, and to enjoy every day to its fullest.

Lois is survived by her husband of 55 years, Edward Hunter of Park Falls, WI and two daughters Cathy Gilbert of Glenview, IL and Jennifer (Hunter) Morris (Jason Morris) of Park Falls. Granddaughters Jessica (Gilbert) Ferrara (Vincent Ferrara) of Gurnee, IL, Jaimie Gilbert of Glenview, IL, Tatum Morris, along with her two cats Lily and Snickers.

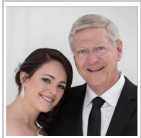
