June 28, 1919 - July 6, 2019

Luise M. Eisenbraun, age 100, of Boulder Junction, passed away on 6th July 2019. She was born on 28 June 1919, in Hattstedt, Germany. Luise was preceded in death by her first husband, Peter Garms, a casualty of WWII, and her second husband, Anatoli Eisenbraun. She is survived by four children, Peter (Signe) Garms, Ilse (Barry) Ohlsson, Tony (Bonnie Scheehle) Eisenbraun and Julia (Russell) Cluey; 10 grandchildren, 28 great grandchildren, and 8 great-great grandchildren. Luise immigrated to the United States in 1952 with Anatoli Eisenbraun and two children, Peter and Ilse. She and her family arrived as indentured servants who worked on a dairy farm in Arcadia, WI, for one year before moving to Boulder Junction.
