May 19, 1918 - February 25, 2012

Marion C. "Jack" Berryman, age 93, of Boulder Junction, died on Saturday, February 25, 2012 at Milestone Senior Living in Rhinelander. He was born on May 19, 1918, in Winchester, Kentucky, the son of Ezekiel and Nellie (nee Curtis) Berryman. Jack graduated from Northern Iowa University. He was a United States Marine Corp. Captain, serving in World War II and Korea. Jack worked at Western Electric, in the Chicago area, for over 30 years. He married Elizabeth Fisher on November 30, 1940 in Waterloo, IA. Jack was a national high school drum champion in 1936. He was a proud Boy Scout, achieving the rank of Eagle. He was a Scout Master for 21 years and received the Silver Beaver award. Jack was on the staff of the B.S.A. National High Adventure Base. He was a Mason with Millersville Lodge #126 in Indianapolis. Jack belonged to the Boulder Junction Lion's Club; he also started and ran the Flea Market in Boulder Junction. Jack was a devoted member of the Community Church of Boulder Junction and was also a volunteer in numerous community activities. Jack was preceded in death by his parents, brother and son, Michael. He is survived by his loving wife, Elizabeth "Betty"; children, Judith (Jerry) Robinson, Dr. John (Catherine) Berryman and daughter-in-law, Lori Berryman; grandchildren, Christy (Dave) Erler, Amos Berryman, Lyndsey (James) Battaglia and Annie Berryman; great-grandchildren, Sabrina and Luke Erler, Miles and Jackson Berryman and William Battaglia and many nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
