Miriam E. Roe, 83 of Woodruff died February 16, 2013 at Ministry St. Clare's Hospital, Weston. She was born February 16, 1930 in O'Fallon, Illinois to Harry and Evelyn Greene.

Upon graduating from O'Fallon Township High School, she attended Washington University graduating with a BA degree in Interior Design. Miriam worked in interior design in St. Louis.
