Peter William Kable of Boulder Junction, WI, age 66, passed away from COVID on Sunday, January 23, 2022 at Howard Young Medical Center. Peter was born November 12, 1955 to William and Irene (McCoy) Kable. He graduated from Lakeland Union High School and attended North Central Technical College where he completed an Associate's Degree in Residential Design. He also completed an Associate's degree in Building Construction from Gogebic Community College. He worked several construction jobs before working at Gabert Construction for 24 years . He recently retired from Camp Manito-wish YMCA after 18 years of service as an Assistant Property Manager and Sr. Maintenance Assistant.

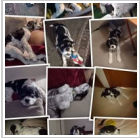
